The HUB Comes Alive

August 17th, 2011 – Princess Park - Renaissance Brandon is proud to celebrate their role in bringing the Downtown HUB alive this summer. A multitude of street and park furnishings have blanketed the area with vibrant colors continuing the transformation of our downtown towards a destination neighbourhood.

To further connect and attract people to the HUB, a Wireless HUB network offering anyone with a network enabled device two hours of access to the worldwide web at no charge.

“It has been a very long time since our downtown has seen this many enhancements and projects implemented in such a short period of time”, states Corey Roberts, Renaissance Brandon’s chairman.

The roll out of street furnishings include new street signs, benches, picnic tables, artistic bike racks, trash and recycle cans and beautiful picnic tables for Princess Park.

“Not only do the benches and picnic tables bring new life to downtown, but they give people a place to comfortably sit and enjoy the day, socialize with others or surf the net”, explains Braden Pilling, Renaissance Brandon’s Downtown Development Specialist.

The Wireless HUB network is fueled by locally owned I-NetLink of Brandon. I-NetLink will be handling the maintenance, billing and support for the network for a period of 5 years.

“We are proud to be a part of this history making project and serving the Internet users of the Downtown HUB,” states Dean Hardy of I-NetLink.

The street furnishings and wireless HUB network was supported and funded through the Province of Manitoba’s Building Manitoba Fund.
